

## PACK LIST

Here is a suggested list of things you may want to bring to Camp during your employment. Keep in mind that the temperature can climb into the mid to high 80°s (F) or 25°C; at night, the temperature can drop into the 30s (F) or 0°C, and because we are located at 6,200 feet, it is even possible to get a rare snowstorm. You will sleep in a tipi, tent, or cabin, but have access to regular flush toilets and showers.

We recommend that you consider bringing the following:

- 7-10 pairs of underwear
- 7-10 pairs of socks
- 3 pairs of durable jeans or other long pants
- 4 t-shirts
- 1-2 sweatshirts
- 2 pair of durable shorts
- 1 pair athletic shoes
- 1 pair “Aqua Socks,” “Teva’s” or similar water footwear
- 1 pair of hiking boots
- 1 hat/cap
- 1 warm winter jacket
- Sleepwear
- 1 bathing suit; women need to wear a one-piece suit at camp
- Theme night attire!
  - Something happy and Hawaiian (camp trivia: Scott, a.k.a. “Kahuna,” is a big Jimmy Buffett fan)
  - Groovy 60s (tie-dyed shirts made at camp are great!)
- 1 beach towel
- Toiletries (soap, toothpaste, toothbrush, comb/brush, shampoo, handkerchief or tissue, deodorant, and a toiletry bag for all these items.)
- 1 bath towel
- Sunscreen (SPF 15 or higher), lip balm, and moisturizing lotion (it is very dry up there)
- Flashlight
- 1 sleeping bag (minimum rating to 20°F/-6°C, preferably to 0°F/-15°C; though it is extremely unlikely that the temperature will drop this low, the extra insulation will make for a more comfortable sleep. A “square-neck” bag of the kind kids take over to a friend’s house for a sleepover will NOT be warm enough.)
- 1 pillow
- 1 bag for dirty laundry
- 1 box of laundry detergent
- 1 duffel bag (We suggest that you pack all of your belongings in a duffel bag.)
- 1 quart water bottle (these are sold at the Camp Store)

1 pair sunglasses with 100% UVA and UVB protection  
Camera and film  
Daypack  
Backpack (optional)  
Stories to read to campers at night (what was your favorite children's  
book?)  
Books  
Walkmans/Radios/CD Players  
Writing paper/pen  
Envelopes and stamps

WHAT *NOT* TO BRING.

Weapons  
Fireworks or other dangerous substances  
Pets or other animals  
Alcohol or controlled substances (other than medications)
